## OFFENCE DETAILS - SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE

## \*\*\*BRIEF OVERVIEW\*\*\*

(Offensive Weapon)

On Saturday, 13th of June 2009, at LONSDALE the accused Samuel Wylie LARKIN had in his possession an offensive weapon namely a baseball bat.

## \*\*\*POLICE VERSION\*\*\*

At about 10.20 pm on Saturday, 13th of June 2009, Police (CAMAC/HOLMES) attended at Roxburgh Avenue LONSDALE, in relation to information received that a male person was walking along the street with a baseball bat.

Upon arrival Police were speaking a group of people who were in attendance at a party on Roxburgh Avenue. One of these persons was a female who is known to police but wants to stay anonymous. Stated that a male person wearing a white multi-coloured hooded top with a large cut on his forehead was smashing car windows that were parked in the street.

Police were later walking around the premises when they observed the accused walk from behind a shed on the property where the party was being held. Police heard the sound of a metal object being placed onto the rear of tray of a truck that was parked on the premises. This area was not well lit and Police did not see the male carrying the bat but no other persons come from that area.

Police subsequently had a conversation with the accused and attended to the rear of truck and located a baseball bat. The accused was wearing a multi-coloured white hooded jacket and had a large bleeding wound on his forehead.

The accused was subsequently arrested and conveyed to the Christies Beach Police Station where he was charged.

The accused LARKIN was identified by fingerprints and photographs.

## \*\*\*ACCUSED VERSION\*\*\*

The accused in this matter Samuel Wylie LARKIN when spoken to by Police stated that the baseball bat was his and he used it to hit a ball down the beach with his dog. The accused gave not reasonable explanation as to why it was on the tray of a truck that did not belong to him and declined to answer any further questions.
